CURRENT REALITY

Review the data provided in your packet. What stands out to you related to food deserts and food insecurity in Kershaw County? What information did the presenters share about this?

- Food deserts are in low income areas
- Need access to healthy and affordable foods to improve our health

- Food pantries, soup kitchens, meal deliveries
- Mobile food pantry

- Senior taking advantage of mobile nutrition center
